Bergere de France Coton Fifty 50g

A Uniforme (23154)	3	3	4	4
B Ficelle (23906)	1	1	1	1

YOU WILL ALSO NEED

- A pair of 2.5mm (UK - / US -) knitting needles
- A pair of 3mm (UK11 / US -) knitting needles
- 5 Buttons
- A stitch holder

TENSION

26 sts and 37 rows to 10cm / 4in square, over stocking stitch using 3mm needles.

Note: Take time to check your tension to ensure the correct fit.

BACK

Using 2.5mm needles & col A, Cast on 63-67-73-81 sts. Work in 1/1 rib for 3cm (1in) [14 rows].

Change to 3mm needles & continue in St st working 9 rows of stripe sequence, then continue in col A until work measures 13-15-17-20 cm (5-6-6 $\frac{3}{4}$ -8 in) [52-60-66-78 rows] total.

Armholes

Cast off 3-3-3-4 sts at beginning of next 2 rows.

Continue on the remaining 7-61-67-73 sts until work measures 23-26-29-33 cm (9-10 $\frac{1}{4}$ -11 $\frac{1}{2}$ -13 in) [0-102-112-126 rows] total.

Shoulders & Neck

Cast off 5-6-7-7 sts, work 14-14-16-18 sts, cast off the central 19-21-21-23 sts for the neck, work remaining 19-20-23-25 sts.

Each side will now be completed separately.

Next row (WS): Cast off 5-6-7-7 sts, work to central cast off sts and put remaining sts on a stitch holder.

Next row (RS): Cast off 2 sts at neck edge, work to end.

Next row (WS): Cast off 6-6-7-8 sts, work to end.

Work 1 row straight.

Next row (WS): Cast off 6-6-7-8 sts.

With ws facing pick up sts left on the stitch holder.

Cast off 2 sts, work to end.

Next row (RS): Cast off 6-6-7-8 sts, work to end.

Work 1 row straight.

Next row (RS): Cast off 6-6-7-8 sts.

LEFT FRONT

Using 2.5mm needles & col A cast on 40-42-46-50 sts. Work 38-40-44-48 sts in 1/1 rib, 2 sts in St st for 3cm (1in) 14 rows increase 1 st at the end of the last WS row for sizes 3 & 6 mths (= 41-43-46-50 sts).

Change to 3mm needles & work in stripe sequence for 9 rows then continue in col A working as follows: 32-34-37-41 sts St st, 7 sts 1/1 rib, 2 sts Border.

Continue as set until work measures 13-15-17-20 cm (5 $\frac{1}{4}$ -6-6 $\frac{3}{4}$ -8 in) [52-60-66-78 rows] total.

Armpoles

Cast off 3-3-3-4 sts at beginning of next RS row.

Continue as set on the remaining 38-40-43-46 sts until work measures 16-18-20-23 cm (6 $\frac{1}{4}$ -7-8-9 in) [64-72-78-90 rows] total.


Lapel

Follow chart for size being worked.

Shoulder & neck

When work measures 23-26-29-33 cm (9-10 $\frac{1}{4}$ -11 $\frac{1}{2}$ -13 in) [90-102-112-126 rows] total cast off at the beginning of every RS row as follows:

5-6-7-7 sts 1-2-2-1 times, then 6-0-0-8 sts 1-0-0-1 times, then the remaining 34-36-38-41 sts.



RIGHT FRONT

Work as for left front reversing all shaping.

SLEEVES

Using 2.5mm needles cast on

41-43-47-49 sts.

Work in 1/1 rib for 3cm (1in) [14 rows] total.

Change to 3mm needles & continue in striped St st for 9 rows, then continue in St st using col A.

AT THE SAME TIME

When work measures 5cm (2in) [22 rows] total increase 1 st at each edge of next RS row as follows:

k2, increase 1, work to last 2 sts, increase 1, k2.

Repeat this increase on every following 8th row 5-3-5-7 times, then on every following 0-6th-6th-6th row 0-4-3-2 times.

Continue on the 53-59-65-69 sts obtained until work measures

18-20-23-26 cm (7-8-9-10½ in)

[70-78-88-100 rows] total then leave on a spare needle.

COLLAR

Using 2.5mm needles & col A cast on 67-75-75-83 sts.

Work in 1/1 rib for 5cm (2in) [24 rows] then leave on a spare needle.

TO MAKE UP

Join shoulder seams over 17-18-21-23 sts at each side.

Graft the collar around neck edge leaving the lapels open.

Then sew the short edges of the collar along the lapel.

Graft the sleeves into armhole.

(See Grafting a Border and Grafting instructions)

Sew side & sleeve seams.

On the Front Left make 5 buttonholes without cutting thread

(See No Cut Buttonhole instructions)


4 sts from the front center edge, the 1st at beginning of lapel, the 2nd 1.5 cm (½ in) from the cast on edge, the others at regular spacings.

Sew on buttons.


Secure & weave in all ends.

LAPEL LEFT FRONT


Size 3 mths




Size 6 mths

■ = P on RS, K on WS


■■ = 2 sts Border over 2 rows

GRAFTING A BORDER

When the border is finished, work a few rows of stocking stitch using a contrasting yarn.

Take the work off the needle and press the stocking stitch section with a warm iron under a damp cloth to prevent it from unraveling. Pin the border to the finished garment, matching the stitches. Unravel all but the last row of stocking stitch. Now graft the stitches, waving the tapestry needle in and out, and unravel the last row of stocking stitch as you go. Bring the needle from back to front through the centre of the second stitch, work a back stitch into the first stitch and bring the needle out again at the centre of the third stitch; now work a backstitch again into the second stitch and continue thus with backstitching as far as the last stitch.





GRAFTING

This technique is widely used in European patterns, but is not so popular among UK and US knitters. When you have completed the sections, do not cast off, but leave the stitches on a spare needle.

Thread a tapestry needle with the matching yarn. Work with right side facing. Place the 2 spare needles together. Insert the tapestry needle through the centre of the first stitch on the front needle as if to purl (leave the stitch on the needle), – and bring the tapestry needle out at the centre of the first stitch on the back needle as if to knit (leave the stitch on the needle), *bring the tapestry needle through the center of the first stitch on the front needle again as if to knit and slip off the stitch, – Insert the tapestry needle through the centre of the next stitch on the front needle as if to purl (leave the stitch on the needle), – bring the tapestry needle out at the center of the next (first) stitch on the back needle again as if to purl and slip off the stitch, – Insert the tapestry needle through the centre of the next stitch on the back needle as if to knit (leave the stitch on the needle)*, maintaining an even tension.

Repeat the movement until the seam is complete. Work all the free stitches into the seam one by one and let the stitches drop off the spare needles as they are grafted together.

The finished seam will look identical to a row of knitting.

STITCHES USED

1/1 Rib, using 2.5 mm & 3.0 mm needles.

Row 1: *k1, p1* rep from *to*

Row 2: k over k, p over p

Stocking St (St-St), using 3.0 mm needles

Row 1: k

Row 2: p

Stripes: Work 2 rows col A, 1 row col B, repeat these 3 rows.

2 sts Border, using 2.5 mm & 3.0 mm needles. Over 2 sts.

Row 1: With yarn at back of work, slip the 1st st purlwise; k the next st.

Row 2: Slip the 1st st purlwise, p the next st.

Repeat these 2 rows.

NO CUT BUTTONHOLES

Using a sewing needle, pick up the horizontal strand of the stitch where you want to place the buttonhole, pull it up and attach it 2 rows higher with a few little stitches on the wrong side of the work.

Repeat with the horizontal strand below the first strand, and attach it in the same way 2 rows down.
